This half term our learning journey will explore: What's in the Toy Box?

What we will be learning:

Science— Materials

To identify the materials toys are made from and why they are made from it.

To group and compare toys by material property.

Describe physical properties of materials and toys.

Computing

To programme toys using directional language.

To write and follow detailed instructions for toys.

To de-bug, improve and evaluate the sequence.

DT:

Design, make and evaluate a toy vehicle with at least 2 axis for a car museum.

Narrative-Lost in the Toy Museum

Persuasive advert for a toy

History:

To compare toys from the past to today and how they have changed.

To order toys on a timeline and use time words e.g. a long time age, before I was born, a few years ago etc.
