Happy New Year and welcome back to school. We are looking forward to the new term and the lighter nights and better weather to come. Just a reminder, if you haven't already done so, please book in for parents virtual meetings which are being held on Tuesday 11th and Wednesday 12th.







This week, **Goldsworthy** class have started their new topic 'To infinity and beyond!' We considered the big question; 'What is out there?' and our learning by reading the story Whatever Next, learning about famous astronauts and writing a list of things we would take to space.

Mondrian class has talked about the tradition of New Year's Resolution and we have written sentences to remind us what we want to achieve in 2022!

In **Kiely** class this week we have been using counters to make equal groups and have started learning about our new topic: Greenland! We've also been learning the story of the Magic Paintbrush: A Chinese folktale which makes whatever you paint come to life! In reading we have been laughing our socks off with our new book: The hundred mile an hour dog.

In **Year 5** this week, the children have been incredibly engaged in their new theme: Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. Year 5 began researching who the Anglo-Saxons were and even completed a mood board based on the Anglo-Saxon culture. The children have used their inquiry skills and asked lots of questions linked to their new unit, which we will spend the term learning the answers to. Year 5 have also enjoyed learning different methods for multiplication in Maths, which they were all extremely successful with. Next week, we will continue our investigation into the history of the Anglo-Saxons and will begin our writing unit based on the story: Beowulf.

This week **Year 6** have started researching the British Empire and Industrial Revolution. So far they have started their learning using their Inquiry STEM skills, researching and sequencing main events between 1750-1900. They have also explored how the Britain shifted from an agricultural society to an industrialised society, providing explanations of differences between the two types of living.

Homework and Reading Reminder

Please ask your child if they have homework, reading and spellings to complete and support them with this where you can. This could be finding them a quiet space, helping them to work out what they need to do and giving encouragement. Reading with your child builds language skills, improves their concentration and academic abilities, it helps them relax at the end of the day too
