It has been a busy few weeks in Year 5. The children researched, designed and made their own 'Painted Pebble' product and sold them at the recent Summer Fayre making a total profit of £51! The children then shared their hard work during Enterprise Week with a presentation via Microsoft Teams to the Year 5 children at Beechwood. They have also been creating their own artwork inspired by the artist John Dyer who is known for his rainforest paintings.





## STEM update—Summer 2022

### Goblin Go-Kart Event

Discovery MAT worked with apprentice engineers from Becton, Dickinson and Company (BD) to build and race go-karts as part of a regional project organised by Greenpower Energy. The children worked hard to ensure that the cars were 'race ready' and were able to take part in the exciting event at Predannack Airfield in Cornwall in July. We are excited to further develop our link with BD next year and to continue to work on this project. It allows the children to apply their STEM skills to a range of different contexts while building, preparing and racing the cars.



### MediFest

Discovery MAT sent children from Years 5 and 6 to attend a city wide event at Plymouth Guildhall, designed to raise aspirations and engage the children in STEM. They were able to interact with a variety of different science equipment and experiments. There were stalls from a wide range of different companies from around the city who were able to talk to our children about careers related to STEM. Nick Arnold (the author of Horrible Science), was also at the event and gave a presentation to the children.



# Year 1 Lego Event

Oakwood and Beechwood Year 1 children attended an exciting event at Market Hall, Plymouth. The children worked as a team to design and build a Lego model and used their coding skills to program a moving element to the model. They then attended the Plymouth Festival where they were able to showcase their work to industry professionals, take part in fun challenges and celebrate their amazing work! Children from Discovery MAT were complimented for showing such fantastic behaviour on the trip.



# International Day of Women in Engineering



Year 6 children from across the 3 schools in our MAT attended a special day at Schneider Electric to celebrate International Day of Women in Engineering. The children were given a tour of the factory floor where they were able to see the wide range of products being made, able to participate in a variety of STEM related challenges where they applied a range of their STEM skills. The day was designed to raise the profile of women in STEM and to inspire girls in our schools to pursue careers related to STEM.



# STEM Week July 2022—Enterprise Week

The theme of our summer STEM week was 'Enterprise Week'. We encouraged the children to research, design, make and sell a product for a profit. Some of the classes had to apply for a 'business loan' from their head of school, which had to be paid back at the end of the project. The children were able to choose how to spend the money that they had made on a celebration at the end of term. The children were also able to present their project to parallel year groups in another school in the trust. They evaluate the products together, shared what had gone well and how they could improve on it in the future.

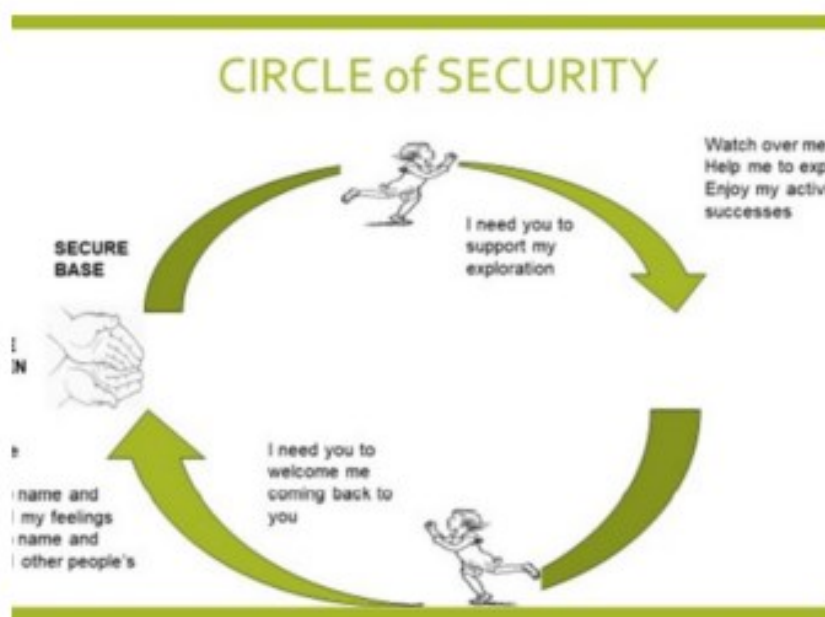
# Plymouth University Visit
