In maths, Matisse class have been using their problem-solving STEM skill. They used cubes to make two equal groups and then wrote down the correct number sentence.







Monet have been learning about Christianity and the importance of the story of Pentecost. They then used creativity to colour and make a windmill with the symbols Christians use and associate with Pentecost.







This week in RE the children of DaVinci class have been looking at the events of the Pentecost. Here they are using sequencing cards to challenge their recall and put them in order.







This week the children have been learning about symmetry and created their own symmetrical butterflies by painting one half of the paper, folding it over and then folding it back to reveal their symmetrical butterfly. Our class caterpillars have now all built their cocoons and we are all very excited to see their transformation into butterflies very soon.









This week, Year 6 used their 'Problem Solving' STEM skills in Spanish lessons by playing a range of games involving cue cards to develop their Spanish vocabulary.





In computing, Matisse class have been using their creative STEM skill to design bridges .







This week in Year 5, we started to read a new book: 'Middleworld'. We were excited to hear about the character Max and the adventure that awaits him. After creating story maps to help us recall the story so far, we began planning to write our own versions of the rest of the story. In Maths, we have now moved on to retrieving our prior learning of decimal numbers before we begin exploring decimals as fractions.
