This half term our learning journey will explore: UK Climate

Our Big Question is: How do plants grow best?

Our Destination will be: To design and create their own garden, using IT and share on school newsletter/social media.

What we will be learning:

English: - Narrative – The Seed and Instructions – Seed planting

Maths: Money. Multiplication and Division.

Science:

<u>Plants</u>

To observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

To investigate different growing conditions for plants.

To discover the life cycle of a plant or tree from seed to maturity.

Geography:

Locational Knowledge & Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

To identify the UK, it's countries and seas surrounding it.

To investigate climate across the UK and how this affects plant growth and where different plants grow.

To use ariel photography to identify features of a garden.

To create a simple arial map of their garden with a key.

<u>RE</u>: Why does Easter matter to Christians? (Salvation)

PSHE: What helps us to stay safe?

Art: Printing

To look at the work of the artist, William Morris. To design and make a printing block with found objects onto card (e.g. string, seeds, match sticks, wool etc). Roll with ink and print into sketchbooks. To explore pattern and shape with found objects.
